SALMON BOOTH at ART IN THE PARK:

The 32th Anniversary of the Salmon Booth in the Art in the Park Show is "in the books." This year RRGC and Columbia Basin Fly Casters will each receive \$1,926.73. The net profit is one of our worst years ever, probably due to the extreme heat on Friday. The "Salmon

Sandwich", in its 18th year, continues to be a good seller. The third year of the Chicken Dinner provided a non-fish alternative that also contributed. A total of 295 pounds of salmon fillets were prepared and served as sandwiches or dinners, and 78 pounds of chicken thighs and breasts were BBQ'd for dinners. We estimate that we served about 300 salmon dinners, 340 salmon sandwiches, 80 chicken dinners, 360 bottles of water, and 300 fountain drinks. We continue to get many compliments on the dinners and sandwiches.

We would like to give *special* thanks to Lance Sawyer, Columbia River Catering Company, for providing space at the Shilo for us to store the salmon and to marinate the fillets. Also a big THANK YOU to Grigg's Ace Hardware for the loan of their towable Traeger grill used for cooking the chicken. John Pfeiffer and his

"booth crew" again did a great job with the booth setup, tear down and storage thanks. Thank you Frank Scopa for the loan of your Smoke Vault used for hot holding and the Honda generator for supplemental power. We also appreciate the loan of the enclosed trailer from John Prather that was used for secure storage of supplies at the park – thanks! Thanks also to Gaylord Pyle for the many years of providing a storage container to store our cookers and associated equipment/supplies needed for the booth. Lastly but not least, thanks to Dale Schielke for his tremendous leadership for the event again this year and to Dave Myers for being the co-chair for the Salmon Booth operation.

MCNARY NWR WATERFOWL LOTTERY

The application deadline for the McNary NWR waterfowl hunt lottery for the 2016-2017 season is 3:30 PM on September 9, 2016. There is a non-refundable, \$12 lottery entry fee for online registrations. The fees are higher if you complete a paper registration or pay by check. The McNary Headquarters (Fee Hunt) Unit is open for hunting three days per week -Saturday, Sunday and Wednesday – as well as Thanksgiving and New Year's Day. No adult reservations are accepted for the Youth Hunt Day, November 12, 2016. There is a daily hunting blind fee for each hunter (reservation holder and standby recipients) and guests, payable at the time of the hunt, of \$14 (\$7 for America the Beautiful Senior or Access card holders). There is no fee for hunters aged 15 years and younger. To learn more about how the McNary NWR waterfowl hunting lottery works or to enter the lottery, go to www.fws.gov/McNary/lottery.

the Wild Game Dinner. Johnathen Jencks, Frank Scopa's grandson from Anchorage, Alaska, gave a summary of his experiences the prior week at Youth Summer Camp on Orcas Island. The winner of the Liar's Contest was young Joshua Hall who maintained great eye contact with the audience. Second place was awarded to Mike Estes and third place went to Larry Martin. It was a fun evening with plenty of good food and lively conversation.

CONSERVATION/HABITAT: Larry Martin checked for guzzler damage from the Benton City McBee Grade fire on August 2. Guzzlers #4 and #5 were hit: #4 is already scheduled for complete repair and #5 with its metal legs came through with only a small 2" burn hole at the edge of fiberglass top. On August 15, Larry checked guzzler #214, also near Benton City. Guzzler #214 was not hit by resent fire but may have been hit in past fires. It needs all new catchment aprons, although it is still catching some water, and also needs 4 new corner posts for the perimeter fence. Larry recently discovered this guzzler by Google Earth satellite.

It is still summer but hunting seasons are quickly approaching and are as little as a few days away. If you are successful, please consider sharing a portion of your bounty for the Wild Game Dinner. 
