Worth Mathewson will be the guest speaker at the WGD. Worth Mathewson of Amity, Oregon has been selected as the program speaker for the Wild Game Dinner which will be held on March 25. 2017 at the Shilo Inn in Richland. Mr. Mathewson is an avid, life-long hunter and is field editor for Delta Waterfowl, an organization principally involved in funding postgraduate waterfowl research. He has written articles for more than forty magazines, is the author of five books, and has compiled or edited nine additional titles. He has hunted in several states and countries including a trek to Alberta and Saskatchewan this fall to pursue waterfowl. The title of his dinner presentation is "Birds: Huntable and Non-Huntable".

HUNTER EDUCATION CLASS – Ron Ruth reported to the executive board that there will be one hunter safety class conducted during 2017 spring break. Ron Ruth reported that the class will be a daytime class. Further details will be forthcoming as the time for the class draws closer. Ron reported that WDFW furnished several new firearms to be used for the Hunters Education Range Day. Ron also informed the Board that there is a group in the Sunnyside area that would like to either get trained as Hunter Safety instructors or affiliate with RRGC in some manner to provide training in the Sunnyside area. A motion was made, seconded and approved unanimously for Ron Ruth to take the lead in this effort and report back to the Board as to the feasibility of training and further cooperation with the Sunnyside group.

The Hunter Education youth pheasant hunt is currently scheduled for February 18, 2017. WDFF has informed RRGC that WDFW will be providing all the birds for the hunt. This event will be coordinated between Limits Game Farm, Pheasants Forever, WDFW, and RRGC. We are planning on an enrollment of 25 students for the event from previous Hunter Education classes.

Dave Hedden gave an awesome presentation on winter walleye fishing. Dave spoke about the gear he uses, his strategies for what type of water to fish, different bait presentations, and how to fish the different seasons of walleye fishing. This is Dave's gear list he recommends for fishing walleye



Dave recommended fishing the seams in the current, drops, transition zones from slower to faster water, the back current on eddies, channel edges, bottom transitions from rock to sand, near structures, main river sunken islands, smaller rock piles, small rolling dips in the bottom.

On Monday January 9th at 11:30 am, Larry Martin got a call from WDFW Officer Kerry McLerran about a deer that was pulled from the icy Yakima River by Columbia Basin Dive and Rescue. The deer was successfully pulled from the river but was too far gone and died from hypothermia. Officer McLerran said everyone involved was disappointed that the deer did not make it but Columbia Dice and Rescue personnel were glad to get the practice in ice filled cold water rescue. Offer McLerran brought

the deer to Larry Martin's house. Larry salvages approximately 50 pounds of meat then delivered it to the Union Gospel Mission in Pasco.
