3-5-22 Team of Greg Herrin, Mark Kerns, Mark Schwartz, Blaine Schwartz, Larry Martin & David Dorsett installed guzzlers #339 & #340 on David's land, N Touchet River road and Sims Road area Walla Walla County. It was a bunch of work digging holes for the tanks, but we were rewarded when David cooked hamburgers for everyone for lunch, they were great. We're gradually getting the guzzlers that were pulled by other landowners due to crop change reinstalled. Blaine Schwartz won the Greg Herrin painted and signed fishing lure.
