March 5 General Meeting Presentation 7:00pm at the Richland Public Library

The speaker for our March 5 meeting will be Todd Miller, WDFW District 4 Fish Biologist, who will present the annual fishing forecast for our local waters. If you have a catch record card for salmon, steelhead, and sturgeon that needs to be submitted by April 30, 2024 you can bring it to the meeting and save a stamp. Todd will collect them and submit them for us. This should be a very busy meeting with annual election of Officers and Trustees, renewal of memberships that expire on March 31, last chance to purchase tickets to the Wild Game dinner that will be held on March 23, and an opportunity to purchase chances in the Quality Trip drawing that will be conducted at the Wild Game Dinner.

Elections and Annual Meeting

The club's bylaws identify the March general membership meeting as our annual meeting where the first item of New Business is the election of Officers and Trustees for the next



year (April through March). Our Board of Directors consists of four elected officers (President, VP, Treasurer, and Secretary), up to 15 elected Trustees, and the Immediate Past President. - Sunday, March 3 at 9am Appetizer preparation; probably meatballs and smoked fish cakes. Also the sausages will be put on the smoker.

Quality Trip Rules

Annual membership dues expire on March 31. Dues must be paid for 2024 to be eligible to enter the 2024 Quality Trip drawing. Each member is eligible to purchase two chances in the drawing but members who have performed volunteer work on a number of RRGC projects and activities are eligible to earn additional chances. A <u>free chance</u> in the raffle

will be offered to any member who 1) purchases a chance in the drawing, and 2) has accumulated 20 or more hours of volunteer work on club sponsored projects during the preceding calendar year (January 1 through December 31, 2023). A <u>second free chance</u> will be offered if the individual purchases 2 or more chances and has accumulated 40 or more hours as described in the preceding sentence. No member may be awarded more than two free chances in the drawing. Volunteer service on the following projects will count towards the accumulated hours.

Tri-Cities Sportsmen Show Recap

Thanks again to everyone who helped at the Lunker Lake kids fishing pond and kids Air Rifle Range at the Tri-Cities Sportsmen Show. 1,282 trout were caught during the three days. Only 85 remained when the pond was drained at the end of the show. Daily catch was 291 fish on Friday afternoon, 580 on Saturday, and 411 on Sunday. Proceeds from the event were \$2,629 for fish caught on Friday and Saturday, \$1,000 from Grigg's Ace Hardware for fish caught on Sunday during the Free Fishing Day, and \$250 from Shuyler Productions, the Sportsmen Show producer, for a total of \$3,879. Shuyler also paid for the plastic pond liner, hooks and bait, and the rental of a sump pump. RRGC expenses were \$1,286 for fish food for WDFW to raise the trout, \$157.53 for prizes for tagged fish caught, \$50 to replace a fishing net that was broken during the pond take down, and about \$200 for food for volunteers. Net proceeds to RRGC were about \$2,200 but we also made a lot of kids and their families happy, spread the word about our club and got a few new members, and promoted the principles for which RRGC exists. John Prather and Larry Martin delivered the donated trout from Lunker Lake to Blue Mountain Wildlife in Pendleton, Oregon for food for birds of prey. Lynn Thompkins and her assistant had just finished a blood test on the eagle pictured below that showed chelation therapy was successful in removing a high concentration of lead in the blood. When found the eagle was so weak it couldn't fly and is now strong enough to be returned to the wild soon. Lynn urges people to use nontoxic shot and projectiles as much as possible when hunting.



Salmon in the Classroom

Volunteers delivered food for the soon to hatch young salmon in fish tanks at 41 local schools on February 8, 2024. The young fish will be released by students at the East Columbia Park boat ramp during the Salmon Summit on Monday April 15 and Tuesday April 16. Wood Duck Nest Box Maintenance

Dale Schielke reports the annual maintenance of the RRGC wood duck nesting boxes is underway. 205 of the 580 existing nest boxes have been checked as of February 20. Annual maintenance includes removal of the old nesting material, documenting what was found (number of membranes, old eggs, and use by other species), and installing new nesting material. So far, we have found 686 membranes, recaptured 2 previously banded screech owls, and banded one new screech owl. We have only been able to check boxes that we can reach by land due to a stand-down of all WDFW volunteer projects on the water or less than 6 feet from a bank due to two WDFW employees drowning within the last 6 months. This may impact our ability complete the annual maintenance before April 1 on the boxes that we access from boats.



Guzzler Maintenance

Larry Martin reported that he inspected several water guzzlers between Benton City and Prosser this past month. New steel posts were installed to replace burned posts on guzzler #4. Larry inspected and cleaned guzzler #2 and found a small hole burned in the top of the fiberglass water tank top by a fire. The hole will require repair at a future date. Larry was surprised to find that damage to Guzzler #16 was already repaired by someone else.

Veterans Duck Hunt at Barker Ranch

WDFW set February 3, 2024 as a special migratory bird hunt day for youth, veterans, and active military. RRGC members who are military veterans were invited by Michael Crowder, manager of Barker Ranch in West Richland, to participate again this year in the veterans' hunt at the ranch. Kirby Hammond, Dave Miller, Bill Lambert, and Kevyn Halazon

represented RRGC and all were successful in harvesting their limits of ducks. Many thanks to Michael and the Barker Ranch owners for providing this opportunity to our members.

RRGC Memorial Scholarship

Applications are currently being accepted for Richland Rod and Gun Club Memorial Scholarships. The scholarship is named in memory of the club's devoted members now deceased. Eligible applicants should be pursuing a conservation related degree such as natural resources management, fish and wildlife sciences, forest resources, range ecology and management, or similar wildlife or natural resources related program and have enough college credits to qualify as junior status by next fall. Scholarship selections are based on merit. Applications must be postmarked no later than April 10, 2024 or submitted via email to <u>rrgcsecretary@gmail.com</u> by April 15.

Hunter Education Pheasant Hunt - by Ron Ruth

This year's 2023 Hunter Ed Pheasant Hunt was held on February 17, 2024 at the Limits Game Farm near Mesa. There were 25 hunter education students present this year. The first group started out at the Connell Gun Club with some clay bird shooting to warm the students up for their hunt. After clay bird shooting the first group went down to Limits Game Farm and was given a safety briefing for the upcoming hunt then paired up with mentors and dog handlers and proceeded to their hunting location. This year we had a couple of different hunting areas from the past couple of years that added some interesting opportunities. The second group of students arrived around 10 am at the Connell Gun Club and proceeded to shoot clay birds warming them up for their hunt. After the second group finished shooting clay birds, they went down to Limits Game Farm and were met by the first group of students coming back from their hunt. At that time all the students attended a "hunting clinic" put on by Dave Myers of Richland Rod & Gun Club. At the end of Dave's presentation, the WDFW game enforcement officer Tom Bolt spoke to the students about his role as a game enforcement officer. After the clinic everybody met in the main building where a awesome lunch was provided by Limits Game Farm and Pheasants Forever (PF). This year we fed approximately 100 people. The chicken, Tri Tip, and all the fixings were attacked, and nobody left the dining hall hungry. After lunch the second group of students was given a safety briefing for their upcoming hunt and paired up with mentors and dog handlers and proceeded to their hunt. Around 4:00 pm the afternoon hunters were back at Limits Game Farm with their harvest of birds. WDFW provided over 80 pheasants that

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were released for the two hunting groups. The weather was great. Almost all the student hunters got a bird, and all of them got to shoot at a bird. A lot of shooting was done by all the students and a lot of ammo was expended! Special thanks goes out to several of the sponsors of this year's hunter ed pheasant hunt: Ringold PF Chapter for purchasing and preparing the food and birds, Connell Gun Club for providing the facilities and clay bird thrower, Marylin Steele for delicious desserts, WDFW for providing the birds and guns for those that didn't have one to hunt with, and to Tom Bolt, enforcement officer, for his presentation, Richland Rod and Gun Club for providing guns to those students that didn't have one, and a very nice monitory donation, and Griggs Department Store in Pasco for the hunting ammunition and clay birds, Special thanks to Ashley Reser for helping with the check-in process, and Chyanne King for taking all the photographs. Over 25 individuals volunteered this year as either mentors or dog handlers, several PF volunteers who helped with the set up of the dining hall, did all the cooking, planted the pheasants, and showed the hunter ed students how to clean birds. And last but certainly not least a very special thanks to Dave and Pam Piovesan of Limits Game Farm for all the help, coordination, facilities, and making sure this year's hunter education pheasant hunt was a success. Thanks to everybody!
