Youth Conservation Camp

RRGC sponsored Brody Evans, William Dvorek, and Landin Brown to attend Youth Conservation Camp on Orcas Island from July 23-29. RRGC had budgeted to send up to seven boys and girls to camp this summer and there was interest from families of other youth but summer schedules and logistics interfered. We look forward to hearing from the boys at an upcoming meeting about the highs and lows of their experiences at camp.

Wood Duck Project

RRGC receives partial funding for our Wood Duck Enhancement Program from a WDFW ALEA grant. ALEA is an acronym for Aquatic Lands Enhancement Account which was created in 1994 by the Washington State Legislature to allocate revenue generated from state-owned aquatic land leases to various state agencies that are then shared through grants to non-state or federal agency partners to protect and re-establish natural ecology and environments. Dale Schielke has applied for, and received, two year grants for the Youth Education and Wood Duck Enhancement project continuously since 2013. The newest grant started July 1, 2023 and goes through June 30, 2025. Dale recently submitted the final report for the 2021-2023 grant. More than 500 nest boxes were cleaned and maintained before each nesting season. Video recordings of duckling jumps after hatching increased from 10 in 2022 to 13 in 2023. Banding results for 2023 were 19 banded wood

duck hens recaptured, 23 new wood duck hens banded, 41 banded screech owls recaptured, and 49 new screech owls banded. That is a lot of owls! Congratulations to Dale, his #1 assistant John Merk, and to everyone who volunteered to help make this project a huge success again this year.

Guzzler Repair

Corrie Thorne-Hadley of the WDFW Walla Walla office located a fire damaged guzzler off Hatch Grade Road above Wallula Junction in Walla Walla County and only .2 miles from the Oregon border. Larry Martin constructed a new 8' by10' rain catchment similar to the style Pheasants Forever Walla Walla Chapter uses except Larry's is all metal. Larry, Corrie, Jerry Bloom, Blaine Schwartz, and Bill Watson installed the new rain catchment on July 20. (See photo section below for photo.) Larry also applies for and administers an ALEA grant for guzzler inspection and rehabilitation. The 2021-2023 grant ended on June 30 and a new grant for 2023-2025 began on July 1. During the past two years Larry utilized the assistance of 26 volunteers to inspect and clean 62 guzzlers, make major repairs to 15 guzzlers, and install 5 guzzlers in new locations. The work required 637 man hours and 3,232 vehicle miles donated by volunteers. A big "Thank You" to Larry and his team.
