Introduction to Firearms Class

The Richland Rod and Gun Club along with the Tri City Metallic Silhouette Association held an Introduction to Firearms class on Saturday, August 12 at the Griggs Dept. Store in Pasco. There were 16 attendees, and all but one was an adult. The attendees were taught the different types of firearm actions, sights, ammunition, and parts of a firearm. The most important subject covered was how to safely handle a firearm. By the end of the class all students knew how to handle a firearm safely. After the lecture, the students were provided with the opportunity to try out different firearms to see how they fit their hand and how each different firearm worked; i.e. safety, slide action, etc. Instructors were available to assist the students and answer any questions. This year the volunteer instructors were Jack Pickard, John Drewrey, John Prather, Larry Martin, Dave Myers, and Pete Workman. When the classroom portion of the program was over the class moved out to the Tri City Metallic Silhouette Association range for some shooting. All but one of the students attended the range session. We started about 1:00pm out at the range and finished about 3:00pm. All students were encouraged to fire different firearms and calibers to see the differences.
