For Marilyn Steele, that requires an extra thank you or two since she somehow finds the energy to coordinate both the Wild Game Dinner and KOE fishing events.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all of our board members who put in countless hours organizing and spearheading our numerous club committees. Dale Schielke, with tremendous support from John Merk and other volunteers, monitors and maintains more than 500 wood duck nesting boxes plus runs camera feeds of ducklings jumping from the nests after hatching. Larry Martin chairs the Habitat and Youth Activities committees. Larry and Dale both received WDFW ALEA grants again this year to help fund the water cistern (guzzler) and wood duck nest box programs. RRGC is paying the registration for several young adults to attend Youth Conservation Camp on Orcas Island this summer. Dave Myers provided the inspiration and leadership for our first ever Pikeminnow Derby held in conjunction with members of the Columbia Basin Fly Casters. Richard Sharp provides extensive energy to the Catfish Challenge where he demonstrates his ability to both catch and cook the whiskered fish. Rich has also developed a curriculum and recently taught his first Introduction to Fishing Class. Ron Ruth is not a Board Member but is designated a Special Volunteer. Ron is the RRGC Head Hunter Education Instructor and leads a team of instructors teaching HE at the Grigg's classroom plus Ron is also the inspiration behind the Introduction to Firearms class that will be held again on August 12. Although there isn't enough space here to highlight the efforts of all of our board members and volunteers, the service of each and every one is valued and helps RRGC achieve the purposes for which we exist. In spite of all that we do, we could do even more with greater engagement by more members.

We came together last year about this time licking our wounds from the pandemic wondering what the future might hold for us with the changing times. The good news is that we weathered the storm pretty well. Catfish Challenge Results

The Catfish Challenge was another great success this year. The weigh in and picnic on June 24 were hosted by Matt and Connie Cummings at their home on the Yakima River in West Richland. Seven contestants weighed fish, some of which were caught from the Cummings' back yard. Tyler Davis, O.J. Davis, Cheyanne King, Pete Workman, and Larry Martin weighed in by the advertised 3:00pm deadline. Two highly successful fishermen were late to the weigh in because they needed assistance loading and hauling their catch. The "official" winner was Tyler Davis with a big fish of 8.2 pounds and a total weight of 43.7 pounds. The late arrivers were Mike Aldinger and Rich Sharp who caught a combined weight of 316.5 pounds of catfish. WOW! Mike's big fish was 13.0 pounds with a total weight of 155.9 pounds. Rich's big fish was 9.7 pounds with a total weight of 160.6 pounds. Total weight of all catfish caught was 389 pounds. The big fish were smaller this year than last year but the total weight edged last year's weight of 382.4 pounds.

Thanks to Tyler, O.J., Mike, Rich, Ron Moore, and Todd Hennick for cleaning the fish. Rich and Packy Lackey fried and grilled about 35 pounds of catfish for our dinner. Ron Lucas blessed us again with his amazing homemade French fries. Dale Schielke rounded up the plates and utensils for the picnic and made a very tasty Dutch oven cherry dessert. Rich brought some smoked catfish that tasted as good as Sockeye Candy! A special thanks to Connie and Matt for sharing use of their back yard with us again.
