


<u>June 3 General Membership Meeting</u> 7:00pm at the Richland Public Library

Introduction to Firearms Class on June 21

An Introduction to Firearms class will be held on June 21, 2025. The class will be co-hosted by the Richland Rod and Gun Club and the Tri-Cities Metallic Silhouette Association. Chief Instructor Ron Ruth reports that an article recently ran in the Tri-City Herald newspaper about the class and the class filled in less than two days, but call Ron at 509-737-7350 to get on a waiting list or express interest in possible future classes. Attendees must be at least 18 years old or accompanied by an adult to take the class. The class will be comprised of two parts. The first part will include an introduction to the safe handling of firearms, the different parts of a firearm and sights, the different types of firearms (pistols, rifles, and shotguns), and actual handling of firearms by participants. The second part of the class will include a demonstration of shooting of different calibers of firearms and actual shooting of firearms by the students.

The last classes of the year will be evening classes starting July 7 and September 8. Registration will open on line at

Youth Conservation Camp

RRGC offers to pay the registration fees each year for several boys and girls ages 12 to 16 to attend Washington State Youth Conservation Camp on Orcas Island. Orcas Island is the second largest of Washington's San Juan Island and provides a unique and beautiful setting for campers to experience the outdoors as they learn about the environment and ecosystems around them. Boys Camp this year is July 20 to July 26 and Girls Camp is July 27 to August 2. Parents are responsible for arranging transportation to drop off and pick up campers at the Anacortes Ferry Terminal. Camp week is broken down into four days of classes focusing on outdoor skills, hunter safety, fishing, and conservation with Friday set aside for class competitions. There is also time for other activities like swimming, canoeing, and group sports. Wood Duck Banding

The Wood Duck project team is currently checking nest boxes for nesting hens to band. 360 boxes have been checked as of May 21; 161 were used by wood ducks, and 53 boxes were used by owls. Some boxes have already hatched out chicks and others are nests in progress. New bands have been installed on 43 hens. 17 hens have been captured that were banded in prior years. 21 previously banded owls have been recaptured and 40 new bands have been placed on owls, many of them on owlets that are nearly ready to fledge. One recaptured female screech owl was banded 10 years previously in the same box.

Team leader Dale Schielke anticipates being able to resume live streaming from in-box cameras by about the end of May. Hardware compatibility issues were experienced last year with YouTube. Dale has been exploring new equipment to facilitate streaming to YouTube and believes we are close to getting everything operational. Watch for the links to the streaming on www.rrgcwoodducks.org

We were fortunate enough to find both nesting wood duck hens and screech owls with owlets. A great educational experience! Dale Schielke and Larry Martin represented RRGC at Jason Lee Elementary School Science Night with an informational display on wood ducks and guzzlers.



















RRGC Memorial Scholarship Awarded

The Board of Directors has awarded a \$1,000 scholarship to Kathleen Petersen, a graduate student majoring in Fish and Wildlife Science at the University of Idaho. The title of her Master's program thesis is "Impacts of harvest on dispersal dynamics of gray wolves in Idaho", working as a researcher in collaboration with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game and University of Idaho. Kat's experience includes serving as a research lead on a Bighorn Sheep project with the University of Montana and Montana Fish, Wildlife, and Parks and she has worked as a field lead and research technician on several projects involving elk, black bears, deer, elk, sage grouse, and mesocarnivores in Idaho and Montana. Kat is an Idaho certified Hunter Education Instructor and taught an undergraduate Hunter Education course at the U of I last year. She is an archer who has harvested deer and elk with her bow but she admits that she uses a shotgun to harvest turkeys. Kat is a member of the Wildlife Society (an organization of wildlife professionals) and is a representative to the Idaho Backcountry Hunters and Anglers. We wish Kat the very best in completing her collegiate work and achieving a highly successful career.

Salmon Summit

Nineteen RRGC volunteers donated a total of 69.5 hours for salmon egg deliveries to local schools and for the Salmon Summit fish release on April 29 and 30 in Columbia Park as part of the Salmon in the Classroom program. Kristy Pentico, Education Coordinator for the

Benton Conservation District told Mike Estes "We could not have put on this event without you." According to Kristy, more than 3,000 students participated in the Salmon Summit this year. Thanks to everyone who volunteered their time for this educational and fun activity. Special thanks to Marilyn Steele for providing the folding tables we used as platforms to hold the glasses for the students to take for the fish release.














Pikeminnow Sport-Reward Program

Northern Pikeminnow eat millions of juvenile salmon and steelhead each year in the Columbia and Snake River systems. Money can be earned from May through September by helping reduce the number of pikeminnow 9" and larger feeding on salmon and steelhead smolt during their outbound migration to the ocean. Anglers must register each day before fishing to be eligible to earn money and fish caught must be checked in at the station where you registered. Our nearest check stations are at Columbia Point Park in Richland, at Hood Park in Burbank, and at the Umatilla Boat Ramp. Visit pikeminnow.org for more information including check in station hours and registration using the new Pikeminnow Registration mobile app. Rewards start at \$6 per fish for the first 25 fish checked and

increase to \$8 and \$10 per fish as you reach higher thresholds. You might even catch one of the specially tagged fish that is worth \$500.


Photo of the Month
