Wood Duck Project

All the RRGC wood duck nest boxes have had the old nesting material removed and fresh shavings installed in preparation of the nesting season. Box checks for nesting hens have started and will continue over the next couple of months. Hens that are captured are checked for an existing band and new bands installed if not previously banded. In-box cameras are being installed at select locations that are close to power and internet Wi-Fi graciously provided by landowners. We should have 3 or 4 broadcasts now if everything is working. The first hatch watch is about a week away.

KOE Kids Fishing Tagged Fish Prizes

A total of 1592 fish were tagged prior to the stocking of Columbia Park Pond for Kids Fishing events. Catching was somewhat less for the kids resulting in only 19% of the tags being recovered for the 532 prizes that were purchased or donated. Businesses donating items are Griggs, Amazon, Texas Roadhouse, Ranch & Home, and Dairy Queen. Firsthand reports indicated that the kids were excited about the prizes won. The one major prize of a couple of gift cards, fishing tackle bag, and each of the various Amazon swag items was claimed by the luck fisher that caught one of only two specially numbered tags.









Benton Conservation District

The Benton County Conservation District has been working with Benton PUD, PNNL, WA Grain, US Army Corps of Engineers to offer a new program for high school students called STEM Career Academy. It's based on a model program offered by the Foundation for Water & Energy Education that has been offered for 7 years in the Wenatchee area. The Tri-Cities STEM Career Academy will provide students with hands-on activities and insights into local careers in agriculture and clean energy. Students will get to build and keep a drone, build and race solar cars, tour energy production and agriculture facilities and learn about career pathways to local employment.

Snake River spring Chinook fishery Opens

Action: Opens spring Chinook salmon fishing on the Snake River as described below.

Species affected: Chinook salmon.

Effective dates:

Location A: Open Tuesdays and Fridays only, beginning May 2, 2023 until further notice.

Location B: Open Wednesdays and Thursdays only, beginning May 3, 2023 until further notice.

Locations:

A) Below Little Goose Dam: Snake River from Texas Rapids boat launch (located on the south side of the river <u>upstream</u> of the mouth of Tucannon River) to the fishing restriction boundary below Little Goose Dam. This zone includes both shores and the rock and concrete area between the juvenile bypass return pipe and Little Goose Dam along the south shoreline of the facility (includes the walkway area locally known as "the Wall" in front of the juvenile collection facility).

B) Below Ice Harbor Dam: Snake River from the South Bound Highway 12 Bridge near Pasco upstream about 7 miles to the fishing restriction boundary below Ice Harbor Dam. Rules:

Min. size 12". Daily Limit 4 hatchery (adipose-clipped) Chinook including no more than one adult.

Release all salmon other than hatchery Chinook.

Anglers must stop fishing for salmon when the adult limit has been retained.

Barbless hooks required.
